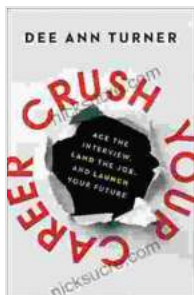

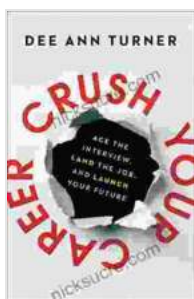
After the Interview
