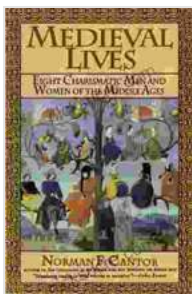

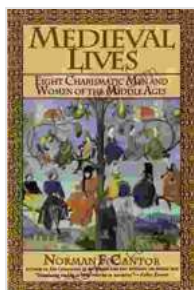

These are just a few of the many charismatic men and women who lived during the Middle Ages. They were leaders, thinkers, and artists who

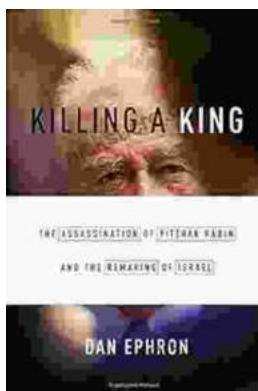
