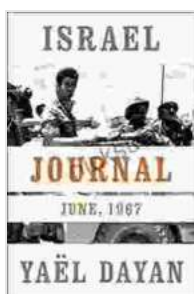


Eyewitness to History: Israel Journal, June 1967
