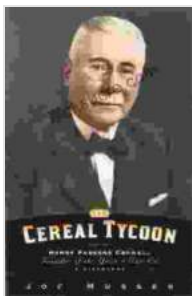


Henry Parsons Crowell: The Quaker Oats Mogul and Progressive Industrialist
