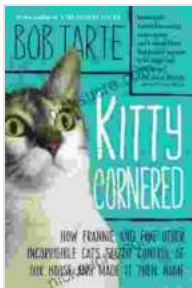


How Frannie and Five Other Incurable Cats Seized Control of Our House and Our Hearts

Frannie, the Feline Matriarch

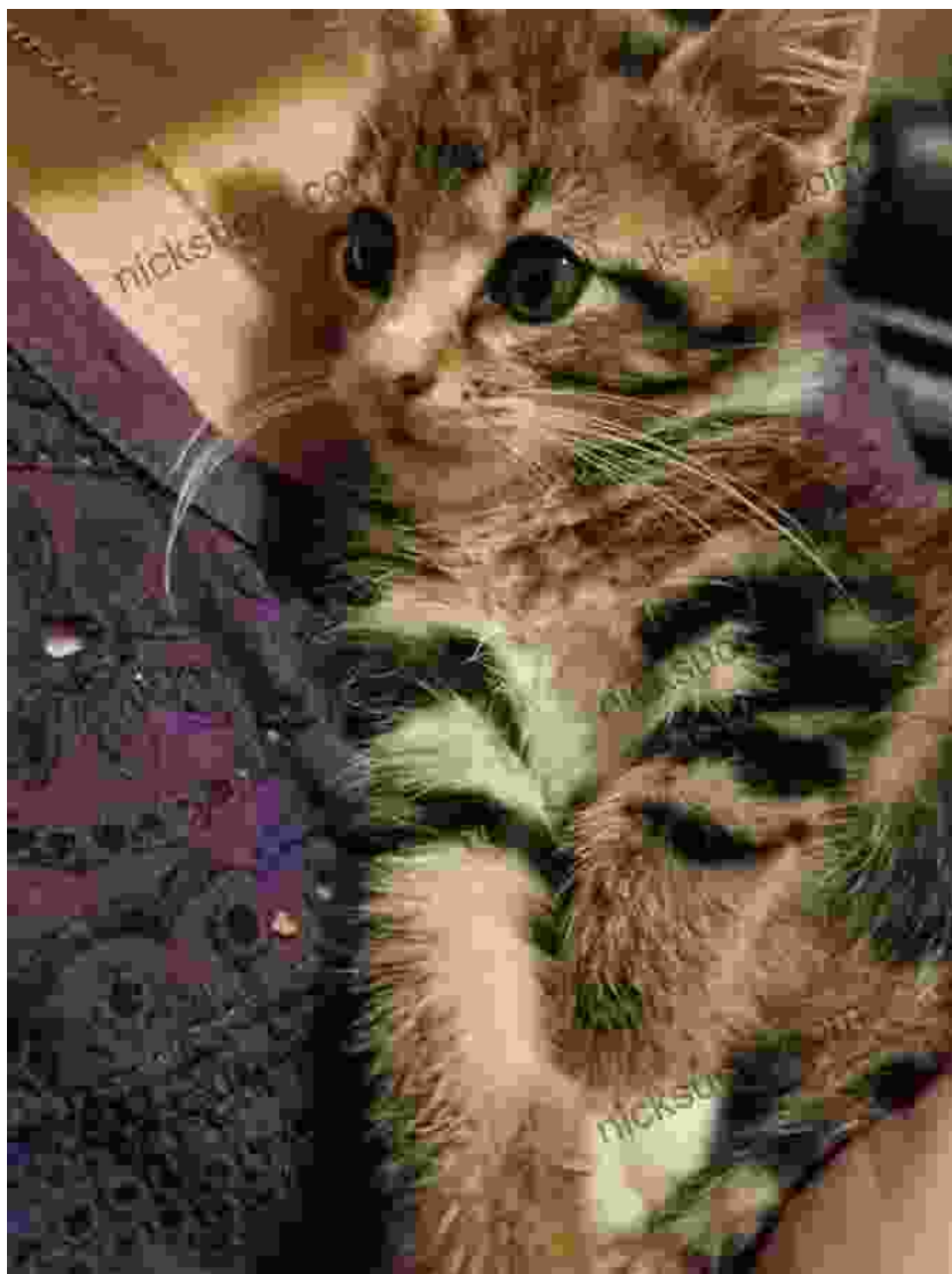
