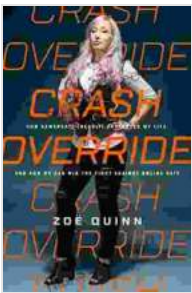


How Gamergate Nearly Destroyed My Life and How We Can Win the Fight Against Online Harassment
