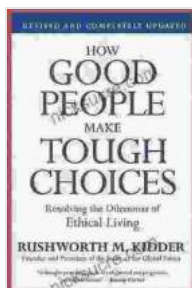

Sandel begins by arguing that there is no such thing as a purely objective morality. All moral judgments are made from a particular perspective, and there is no way to escape our own biases and presuppositions. This does not mean that all moral judgments are equally valid, however. 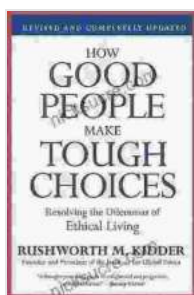

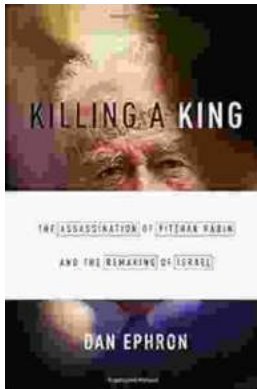

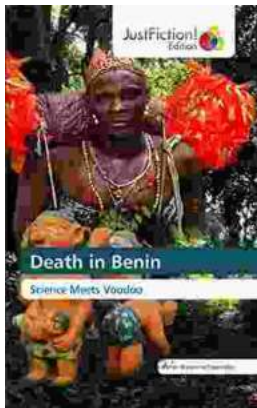
