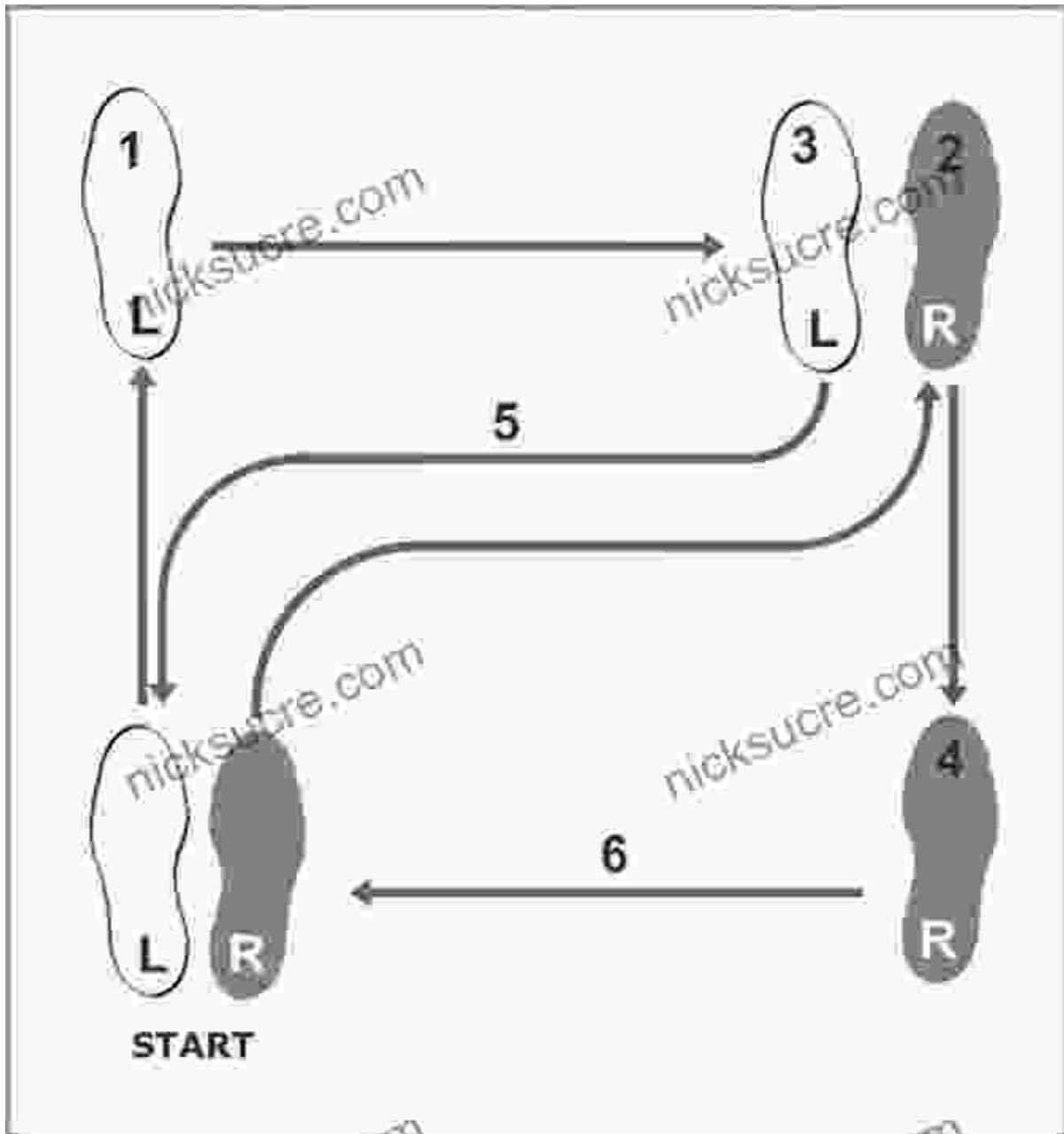


Diagram illustrating the basic step and common variations of the waltz

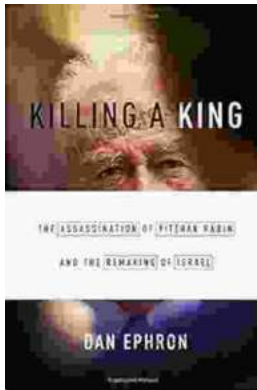
