

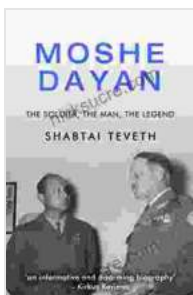
# Moshe Dayan: The Legendary Israeli General and Politician



## Early Life

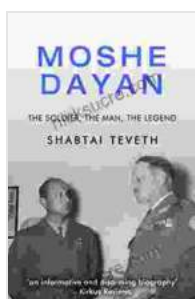

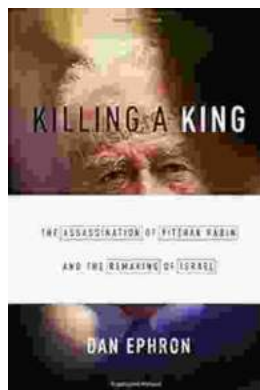

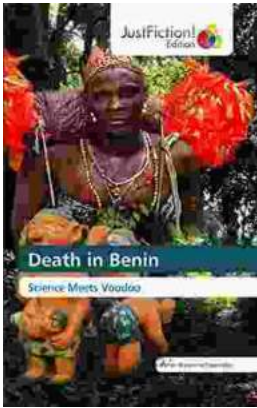
