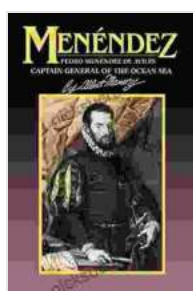


Pedro Menéndez de Avilés: Captain General of the Ocean Sea and Founder of St. Augustine

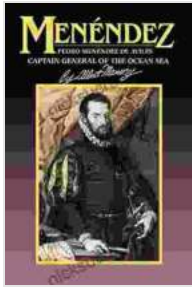

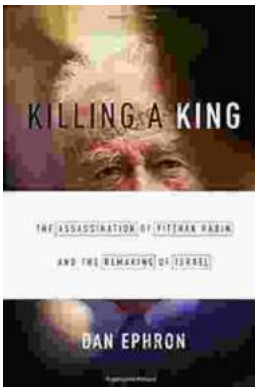

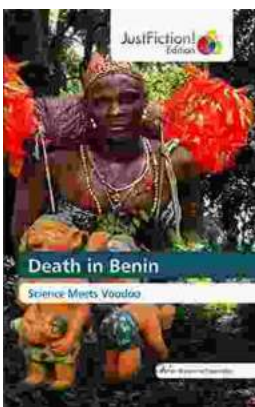
