


The Herald of Free Enterprise Story: A Tragedy of Maritime Mismanagement

The Herald of Free Enterprise was a roll-on/roll-off ferry that operated between Dover, England, and Zeebrugge, Belgium. On March 6, 1987, the ferry capsized off the coast of Belgium, killing 193 people.




