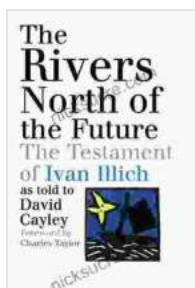

The Roots of Our Discontent

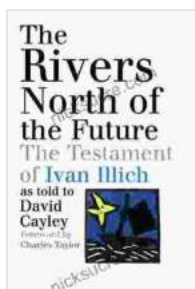
