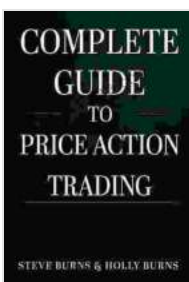

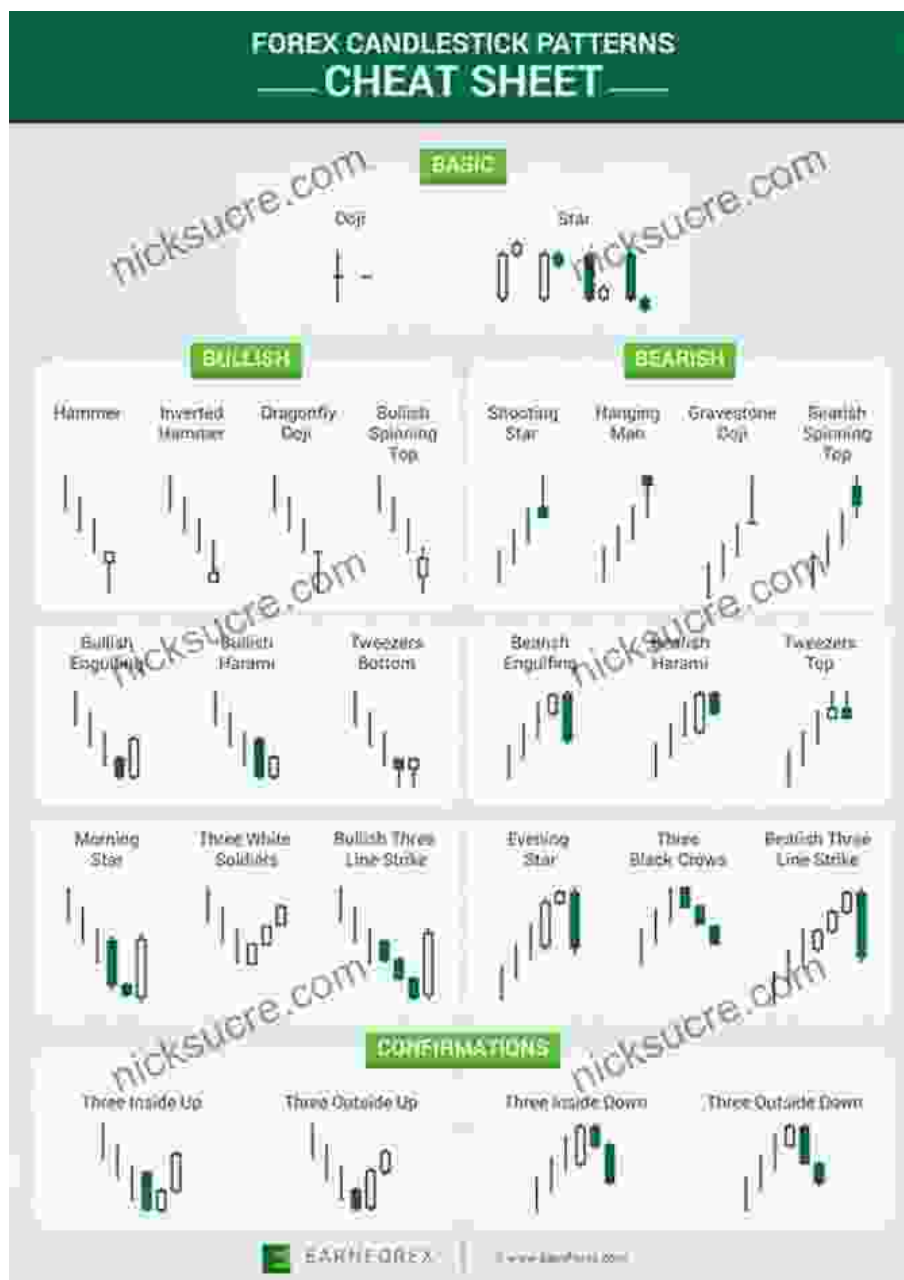

Pullback Trading

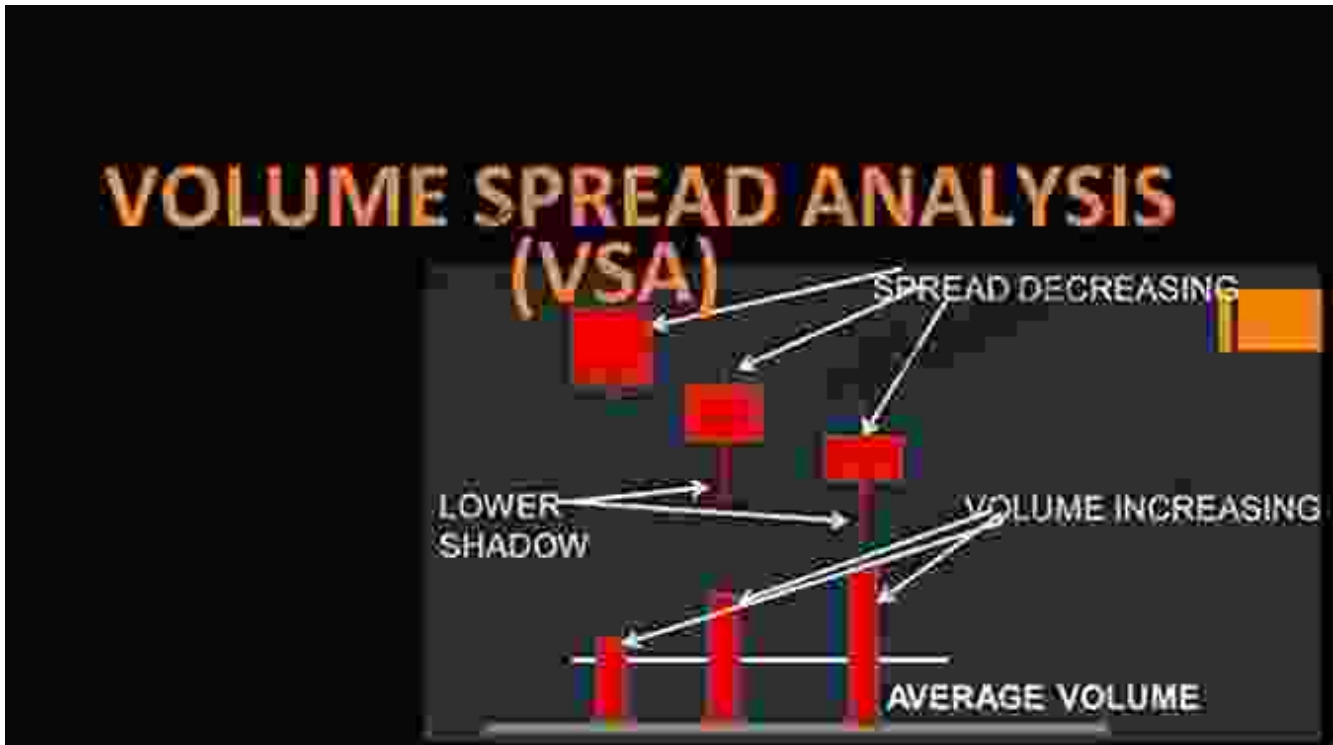

- Signal is stronger if combined by a five-wave impulse pattern or three-wave corrective pattern ending.

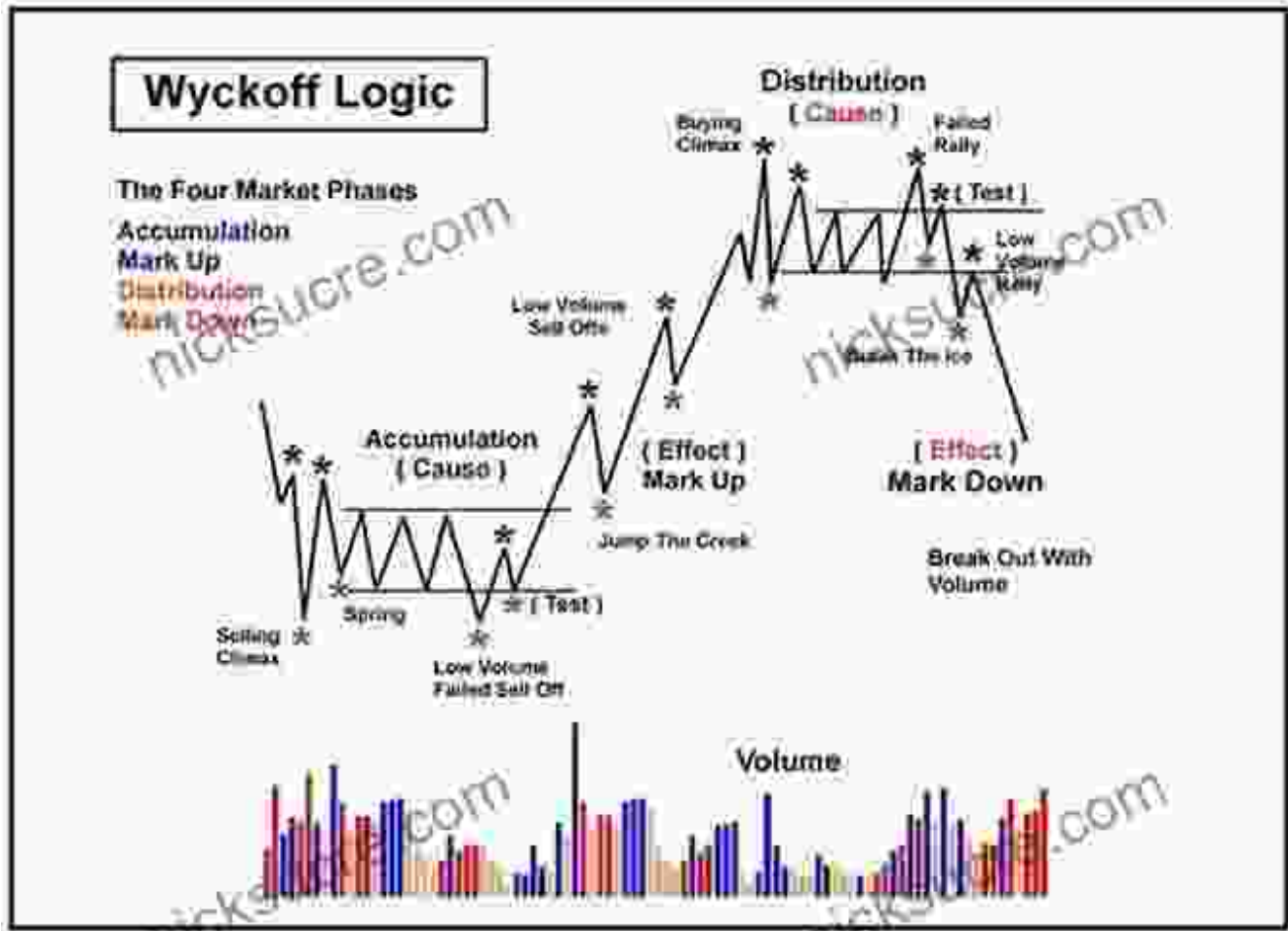

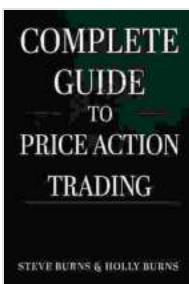
