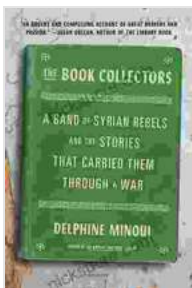


# Voices from the Frontlines: The Stories of a Band of Syrian Rebels, and the Music That Carried Them Through War

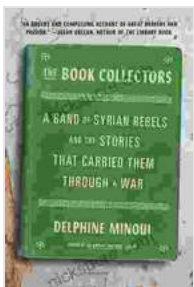

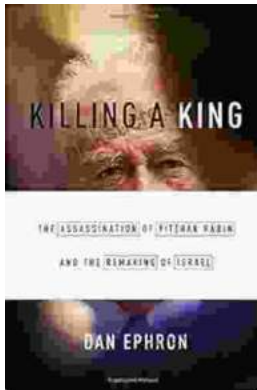

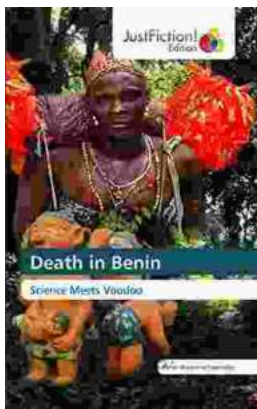
