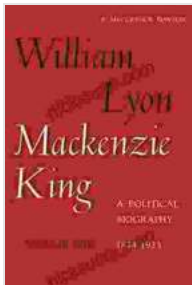


# William Lyon Mackenzie King: A Political Biography, Volume 1: 1874-1923

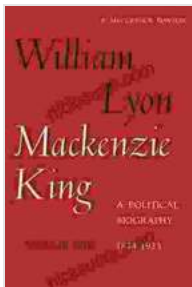
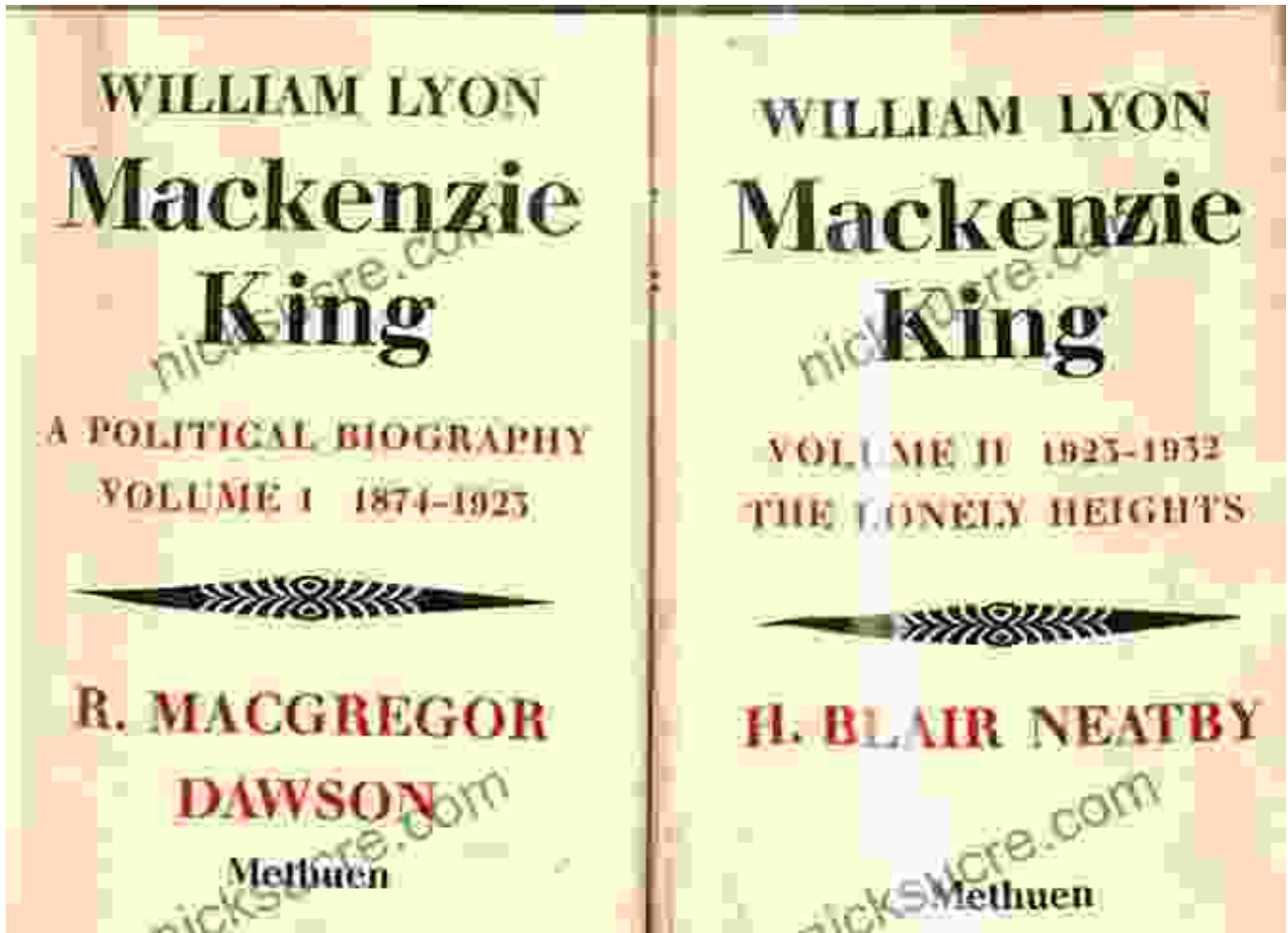

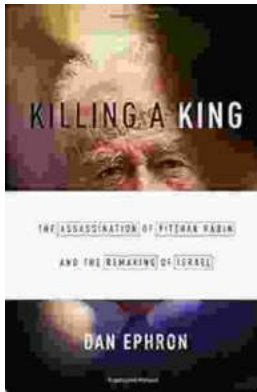
